A note on Standardised Assessment

The professional judgement of our teachers is still the most influential factor in assessing children's learning. Standardised Testing purley <u>supports</u> the teachers in making decsisions about learning. These assessments are for teachers and data analysis <u>and are not always</u> <u>a true reflection of a child-merely a snapshot of</u> the child on that day.

Our P7 pupils have been undertaking the new Scottish National Standardised Assessments this term and P4 pupils are due to start this week. These assessments will replace InCAS and ePIPs at P1, P4 and P7. The data will be used by teachers to inform their planning and assessment.

P3 have started their InCAS assessments. These are being administered in school and the class teachers will use the data to inform their planning. As a Management Team, we also use these results to support tracking and monitoring of learning throughout the school.


Kinellar Seedlings
