Model B - tooth brushing in dry areas

- 2.13 The supervisor should wash their hands before and after the tooth brushing session to prevent cross-infection.
- 2.14 The child (under supervision) is responsible for collecting the toothbrush from the storage system. Discretion should be used if a child has additional support needs.
- 2.15 Toothpaste is dispensed following the appropriate methods (Standard 2). 2.16 Children may be seated or standing while tooth brushing takes place.
- 2.17 Tissues/paper towels or cups must be disposed of immediately after use in a bin.
- 2.18 The supervisor is responsible for ensuring the child rinses their tooth brush under running water.
- 2.19 After rinsing of the toothbrushes is complete, the supervisor ensures the child shakes off excess water into the sink. Toothbrushes should not come into contact with the sink.
- 2.20 Each child (under supervision) is responsible for returning their own toothbrush to the storage system to air dry. Discretion should be used if a child has additional support needs.
- 2.21 Paper towels should be used to mop up all visible drips on the storage system.
- 2.22 Children should be supervised.
- 2.23 Supervisors are responsible for rinsing sinks and cleaning storage system areas after tooth brushing is completed.
