The MA Primary Education Programme is accredited by the General Teaching Council for Scotland.

MA1 - P4M, MA2- P7D, MA2-P4G, MA4-P5C, MA2-P7A, MA2- P5/4, MA2- P6L and MA2 P5T

Some Classes will have a Post Graduate Student (PGDE) and the DELITE version of the PGDE which enables Aberdeenshire employees to embark on a career in teaching though their workplace.

NESCOL and other Apprenticeships



In P2/1, Nursery and P1M, we have students from NESCOL and they will be here throughout the year (one day a week) working towards Early Childhood Qualifications.

Graduate Apprentice

Our Graduate apprentice scheme runs from our Early Years setting and Wendy Genus is based in the nursery and is working towards her qualification on Childcare.

Foundation Apprentice

This scheme is new to us and involves young people at school or college undertaking an apprenticeship under the guidance of staff in the school setting.

Although all our students are heavily supported by the staff in the school, they are also verified externally by their tutors and are subject to the usual checks required by the Scottish Government.
