After school I get my ball Hours & hours practicing against a wall I really miss my football games I guess I have COVID to blame


Not long now till were back I miss my friends that's a fact I'll try and enjoy my summer As this year so far has been a bit of a bummer.

Listening to music, Gardening and baking, Climbed Tappie, played lego, Did lots of craft making.


We've seen frogs, we've seen squirrels, We've seen birds in the tree. We looked after our caterpillars, Then set our butterflies free.



Covid 19 has shook us to our core.


With social distancing, we became spatially aware, don't cough outside cause people with stare.
