
Term 1


Pupil Wellbeing

In line with Government and Local Authority Advice, have a zerotolerance approach to any symptoms shown and will use isolation procedures. The 'Test and Protect' approach will be used for any person who reports symptoms.





Symptoms and what to do Coronavirus COVID-19



- · A high temperature.
- Feel hot to touch on your chest or back.
- A loss or change in what you can normally smell or taste.
- 24 hours

• A new continuous cough.

This means coughing a lot for more than one hour or 3 or more coughs in a day.

If you usually have a cough then this might be worse at this time.

As the seasons change, we are aware that there are many bugs and illness circulating. Please take a cautious approach and if in doubt keep your child at home and seek medical advice.

<u>PPE</u>

Children and adults can wear masks/face coverings should they wish to do so although this is not a requirement in the school ground and building. PPE is being provided to staff to administer First Aid etc.

Face covering must be worn on all school transport.



Organisation

We appreciate everyone's efforts with daily organisation. This includes ensuring children physically have everything they need for the day ahead as well as ensuring they are aware of pick-up arrangements.

We need to continue to do this next term to minimise footfall in the office. We regret that we can not accept items dropped off throughout the day. We always encourage parents to try and make appointments out-with school time if possible. Messages regarding changes to pick up arrangements are taken in emergency circumstances only.

Please be aware that any parents or visitors entering the building is required to provide their contact information in line with the Test and Protect strategy.

Cold and Wet Weather

Please ensure your child comes to school prepared for the weather. Be aware that as guidance currently stands all PE must take place outside and



the outdoor environment should be used to support learning where possible. This means that children will be spending time outside in all weathers.

During breaks and lunch, the children will always be outside to play unless the weather is extreme. This means they must have suitable warm/waterproof jackets and if you prefer, waterproof trousers and boots too.

Children should always have a change of clothes should their PE day be wet and muddy. We will not be cancelling PE in bad weather unless the weather is extreme or too dangerous.

Windows in classrooms will be open most of the time during the day to allow for the circulation of fresh air, it would be advisable for all pupils to have a school jumper particularly as the weather cools down.

Your child's teacher will inform you of when the class will have PE. Timetables are likely to change in the new term so please be aware that days may alter.

School Arrival and Pick-up

It is essential that children arrive on time to school. Late children arriving at the office will seriously disrupt our procedures. Teachers will not accept late arrivals at classroom doors.

Please keep an eye on your child's hands as the weather gets colder, some are already beginning to struggle with dry and cracked hands. We do have a supply of E45 lotion which they are welcome to use throughout the day.
