Symptoms and what to do **Coronavirus COVID-19**



- A high temperature.
- Feel hot to touch on your chest or back.
- A loss or change in what you can normally smell or taste.

· A new continuous cough. This means **coughing** a lot for more than one hour or 3 or more coughs in a day.

If you usually have a cough then this might be worse at this time.

As the seasons change, we are aware that there are many bugs and illness circulating. Please take a cautious approach and if in doubt keep your child at home and seek medical advice.

Face Coverings

Following government guidance, pupils may see staff wearing face masks more frequently in the building. Although school and early learning and childcare settinas are current exempt from the



workplace legislation, we are aware that further advice is imminent. Staff are encouraged to wear a face covering when moving around the building. If you or your children have any questions or concerns regarding this, please feel free to contact the DHT responsible for your child's year group.

Face covering must be worn on all school transport.

School Arrival and Pick-up

The school playground is becoming increasingly busy. For this reason, from Monday 2nd November we ask that only 1 adult attends drop off and pick up to minimise the number of adults in the playground.

Current Scottish Government guidance also states:

"Whilst it is not compulsory to wear a face covering outdoors it is recommended in crowded situations where physical distancing is not always possible. such as at the school gate or at the entrance to a building. In these circumstances you are expected to wear a face covering."

Therefore, we kindly request that, from Monday 2nd November, unless exempt, adults wear a face mask or covering while on school grounds.

Adults are reminded that they <u>must</u> observe social distancing guidance whilst on school grounds. Please do not become complacent with this. Remember, once your child has settled in their line please leave the playground promptly.

We are working on alternative morning arrangements for the P5-7 classes. With the wetter weather the field is becoming very muddy. We will speak to the children about the new arrangements next week.

It is essential that children arrive on time to school. Late children arriving at the office will seriously disrupt our procedures. Teachers will not accept late arrivals at classroom doors.

We are happy for well-behaved dogs to accompany you at drop off an pick up. However, we would kindly ask that you do not stop at the school gate with dogs during break and lunch times.

At the end of the day, please leave the playground swiftly. We still have nursery session running and need to clear the playground quickly.

Cold and Wet Weather

Please ensure your child comes to school prepared for the weather. Children will be spending time outside in all weathers as part of their learning.



During breaks and lunch, the children will always be outside to play unless the weather is extreme. This means they must have suitable warm/waterproof jackets and if you prefer, waterproof trousers and boots too. If you find that this is difficult due to financial circumstances, please contact the school. We will treat this confidentially and seek support to help you equip your child for outdoor learning.

Windows in classrooms will be open throughout the day to allow for the circulation of fresh air, it would be advisable for all pupils to have a school jumper.

PE and PE Kits

Your child's teacher will inform you of when the class will have PE. Timetables are likely to have changed this term. It is advisable to pack a spare set of clothes on PE day in



case your child becomes wet or muddy.
