Reporting Feedback


Before we embark on the Christmas Countdown, can all parents please take time to sit with their child and provide their teacher and the SMT with feedback on their child's learning or how their child feels about their learning experiences. This is so valuable to your child's learning process and ensures that your input about their progress is noted and valued. A link to the Microsoft form for your child's class was sent by email on Thursday 26th November.



Pupil Wellbeing

Before leaving your home, please ensure your child is well and that no other members of the household are symptomatic. In line with Government and Local Authority Advice, have a zerotolerance approach to any symptoms shown and will use isolation procedures. The 'Test and Protect' approach will be used for any person who reports symptoms.





With Winter upon us, we are aware that there are many bugs and illness circulating. Please take a cautious approach and if in doubt keep your child at home and seek medical advice.

Health and Safety Update

We continue to ask that only 1 adult attends drop off and pick up to minimise the number of adults in the playground.

According to Scottish Government Advice, face coverings should be worn by parents and other visitors to all school sites (whether entering the building or otherwise), including parents at drop-off and pick-up.



Please refrain from gathering at the fence overlooking the playground throughout the day. This is our staff exit and must be kept clear to allow for social distancing. If you are meeting your child at the front door a face covering should be worn as this is also school grounds.

Adults are reminded that they <u>must</u> observe social distancing guidance whilst on school grounds. Please do not become complacent with this. Remember, once your child has settled in their line please leave the playground promptly.

We have a plan for alternative morning arrangements for the P5-7 classes. With the wetter weather the field is becoming very muddy. We are continually monitoring this and will bring in the new arrangements when required.

It is essential that children arrive on time to school. Late children arriving at the office will seriously disrupt our procedures. Teachers will not accept late arrivals at classroom doors.

We are happy for well-behaved dogs to accompany you at drop off and pick up. However, we would kindly ask that you do not stop at the school gate with dogs during break and lunch times.

At the end of the day, please leave the playground swiftly. We still have nursery session running and need to clear the playground quickly.

Fechnie Brae

The residents of Fechnie Brae have raised concerns about pupils entering their grounds and car park before and after school. Please ensure your child does not do this and that they respect the ground, property and the residents' space.

Cold and Wet Weather

Please ensure your child comes to school prepared for the weather. Children will be spending time outside in all weathers as part of their learning.



During breaks and lunch, the children will always be outside to play unless the weather is extreme. This means they must have suitable warm/waterproof jackets and if you prefer, waterproof trousers and boots too. If you find that this is difficult due to financial circumstances, please contact the school. We will treat this confidentially and seek support to help you equip your child for outdoor learning.

Windows in classrooms will be open throughout the day to allow for the circulation of fresh air, it would be advisable for all pupils to have a school jumper.

Communication with All Staff

Unfortunately, due to social distancing, Teachers and The Early Years Team should not be approached at the beginning or the end of the day. If you'd like to communicate with staff, please email them or send a message via the school office. If your concern is of a serious nature or a Child Protection concern, please alert one of the office team by telephone and a member the SMT will get back to you.

Who to Contact?

In the event that you have a question or concern, you should contact your child's class teacher in the first instance by phone or email. They are the people who know your child best in school and will be able to resolve



most issues which arise. If you feel that your concern has still not been resolved, then you should contact the relevant member of the management team.
