
P4-7 Rugby

Book Swap



Bikeability

We are looking for volunteers to be able to support the Bikeability programme. The guidance on this has changed in recent years, and **most** of the volunteers will need to have completed the training and therefore need to be able to ride a bike. The course for volunteers is one full day or two half days.

We still require other parents to be extra 'eyes and ears' particularly when working on the road, however training for this is not essential.

The Bikeability programme for the pupils involves at least two hours work in the playground and 6-8 hours on the road. However, this will depend on capabilities and confidence. We have over 60 children this year in P7 so we will need a number of parent helpers. We feel it would be great to build up a
