KSPC

Following our Parent Council Meeting earlier this term, we thought it would be a good idea to have a refresh of resources that we are using school and resources available to you at home.

Decider Skills

In 2021 we introduced the resource The Decider Life Skills. We focused on each skill during Assemblies as a way of teaching the whole school how these skills can be used to help us deal with situations where we might feel overwhelmed or angry. The Decider resource calls this the fizz. Some of the strategies we have introduced are:

STOPP
IT WILL PASS
RIGHT NOW
NAME THE EMOTION
OPPOSITE ACTION
FACT OR OPINION
LISTEN

Ask your child about these, we are sure they will be able to tell you about these and how they can help them calm down in moments where they might feel the fizz.

As an SMT we refer to these when helping children resolve conflict or when we are restoring relationships after a situation has occurred. Over this last session we are also hearing PSAs and teachers using these skills

more and more thus really making these skills part of our ethos and learning culture within the school. Most children are able to choose one that they feel works for them and they too are able to explain how and when they have used the skill to help turn a situation around.

Numeracy Support Booklet


Over the recent years we have worked hard to develop the teaching and learning of Numeracy across Kinellar School. The Parent Council funded Numeracy boxes. Boxes that are filled with a whole array of resources that can be used to support all areas of the numeracy and mathematical curriculum. These boxes were well received by teachers and their learners and are used effectively across the school.

As well as this we created a booklet to support parents at home when supporting their child with Numeracy homework. Often strategies used to teach concepts change over the years and parents often find that their method is different from the way a pupil is taught in class nowadays. This does not mean there is a right or wrong method however consistency when teaching a new concept does help our learners and it avoids confusion. However, once a method is learned and the child is comfortable it can be good for their mathematical development to learn new strategies and this in when other methods can be shown. Learning Pit

The Learning Pit was developed my James Nottingham based on the fundamental theories about how children learn. Making learning easy for children doesn't allow for learners to remember new concept or skills,

However, making learning challenging (putting them in the pit) and working with them by teaching them the skills to get out of the pit allows learning to become embedded and helps pupils to make connections between concepts but also life events/skills and learning. To learn more about the Learning Pit, understand how it is used and how it benefits learners watch this short video .



Most of our teachers attended a training session delivered by James Nottingham and we now use the theory in our everyday teaching and learning. We encourage our learners to think, explain and share their learning. We encourage problem solving and working with each other to help develop skills.

MTV

One of our areas of School Improvement focuses on 'Making Thinking Visible' (MTV). The theory behind this resource is creating a culture where our learners can develop as individuals who can think, plan, create, question and engage independently as learners. As a school we have been working hard to establish a culture where thinking routines are used consistently and regularly to develop essential skills for lifelong learning. We use thinking routines such as see-thinkwonder, zoom in, compass points, chalk talk etc.. to engage learners when introducing topics, collecting opinions/thoughts as well as assessing learning and identifying next steps.

Your child will have used thinking routines in their class – ask them about them.

Pupils Profiles and Parental Comments

Our Snapshot Jotters and Pupil Learning Profiles are a great way to engage in your child's learning. It allows you to discuss their learning at home and find out about what they have achieved and their next steps. Most classes have a class profile too which can generally be accessed on their classes Microsoft Team. This is often where photos and videos are posted so that you can see what has been happening during the day, week, and term. It would be nice to see more parents and pupils commenting on the posts even just a like would be good so we know it is being accessed.

With regards to the Profiles, the Parent Council raised that at times parents struggle to know what to write in a comment or how to write a comment. As the P4-P7 record their learning using PowerPoint Presentations. We suggest that when these are sent home to review them with your child, you add a slide with your comment. Parents are invited to write directly into a Snapshot jotter. Comments can be in the form of 2 stars and a wish.

For example



I really like that you have challenged yourself and started to use descriptive language in your writing.



I really enjoyed seeing your imaginative play with the kapla and makedo.



It would be nice to see your thinking more about challenging yourself with hard termly targets.

Or you could just write a comment like:

"I have really enjoyed hearing you talk through your slides/jotter sharing what you have been learning and how you have achieved success. I will look forward to seeing how you continue to develop these skills at home"

It would be great if you could write your name and date at the bottom of the slide/jotter.

Book Swap




We hope that you enjoyed reading the new book with your child.
