## Coding Club




We would like to thank Miss Ross for developing the Coding Club. We are now into our third block of this and our Codina Club members have really enioved learning different types of code, overcoming lots of challenges and

problems and using our mirco:bits. Coding club allows pupils to think like programmers, where they learn different computer and coding terms as well as developing different skills which are transferable to other areas of school life.

This term we have been focusing on using micro:bits, a small handheld computer, and block code. We have coded our micro:bits to become Magic 8 balls, step counters, send

messages to each other and more. Pupils really have enjoyed sharing their learning with each other and their teachers. We hope to continue Coding Club next session.
